SPRI	Apply for federal financial aid using the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). You can list up to six schools on the FAFSA that you wish to receive your financial aid application. Be in contact with the schools should there be additional information or documentation required.	
 and	Call the school of your choice and confirm that they have received your admissions applications materials, including letters of recommendation housing applications.	
	Request that your high school send a copy of your transcript to the school where you have applied. Make sure your first semester senior year grades are included on the transcript.	
	The information you receive back, after the FAFSA is processed, is the Student Aid Report (SAR). If any portion of the information on the SAR is incorrect, please correct it and resubmit it to the processing center.	
	After deciding which school you are going to attend by the proper deadline, notify the school in writing as to whether you are accepting or declining admission.	
	Review your financial aid award letter with your parents and be sure that you understand the terms and conditions that accompany each kind of aid.	
	Notify the financial aid office of other outside scholarships or grants you have accepted since your initial application.	
	Be aware of due dates for tuition, fees, room and board, and other expenses.	
	Respond immediately to all correspondence regarding school, scholarships, and financial aid.	
	Meet all class registration deadlines.
